

Official Scoring System

Win = 3 points

Tie = 1 point

Loss = 0 points

Tiebreaker (Determines Seeding in Playoffs)

1. **Head-to-Head** – result of pool play game between the two or more teams. If winner not determined then proceed to #2.
2. **Goal Difference in head to head games**– Winner is team that has the highest goal difference out of the head to head games. If winner not determined then proceed to #3.
3. **Goal Difference in pool play games** – Winner is team that has the highest goal difference out of all pool play games. If winner not determined then proceed to #4.
4. **Goals For in pool play games** - Winner is team that has the most goals scored in pool play games. If winner not determined then proceed to #5.
5. **Goals Against in pool play games** – Winner is team that has the least goals scored against in pool play games. If winner not determined then proceed to #6.
6. **Penalty Kick Shoot-Out** –Three players chosen from each team will enter into a rotation of penalty kicks, alternating teams with each kick, with the higher scoring team winning after the first round. If the score remains tied after the first round of penalty kicks, the remaining three players from each team will join in and continue to alternate shots in a “sudden death” format. [If tiebreaker involves 3 teams] Shootout with 1 team receiving a first round bye by random draw.

Tiebreaker (Playoff Play)

In the event of a tie during a playoff game, the teams will play one 3-minute “golden goal” overtime period, with the first team to score a goal being the winner. After the 3-minute period, the teams will enter a penalty kick shoot-out similar to the one described above; however, in this case, the 3 players that shoot in the first round of the penalty kick shoot-out will be 3 players from each team that were on the field at the conclusion of the game. These three players will enter into a rotation of penalty kicks, alternating teams with each kick, with the higher scoring team winning after the first round. If the score remains tied after the first round of penalty kicks, the same three players from each team will continue to alternate shots in a “sudden death” format. If one team has received a red card during the game and finishes with 2 players on the field, a remaining roster player (other than the red carded player) must be chosen to kick in the rotation of penalty kicks. If the red-carded player is the last remaining roster player, one of the two field players must kick twice
